Despite the warm and dry conditions, particularly over the holiday period, the course is holding up well. The irrigation system is working well and the rate of application has been stepped up to meet the current conditions.

We were down a few of our longtime regular volunteers over the last month. Despite that, others gratefully have stepped up and taken on extra roles so the course is still well presented.

Our Grounds Sub-committee, including Ken, have been looking at every hole on the course to see where incremental improvements can be made. Some of the changes are widening the fairway approaches out to the bunkers, where applicable. Also the reclamation of some of the areas on greens that have diminished over time. The changes will be subtle but should improve the playing and aesthetics of the course.

Our fiberglass pins are deteriorating causing splinters and will be replaced soon.

We have purchased a set of verti-cutters for the greens and expect delivery next month. These will help us to regularly de-thatch the greens and lightly sand. We will be coring in the second half of March so there will be some disruption to play during this period.
